

## Summer Institute on Theology and Disability Types of Presentations

Interested in doing a presentation? These are the options currently available:

- 1. **Plenary Sessions**: Usually invited speakers by the planning committee who will be video-recorded for the website. Modest honoraria and expenses. Ideas or suggestions welcome for future plenary speakers.
- 2. **Workshops**: The Institute usually has space for about 30 workshop sessions, either 60 or 75 minutes, depending on the schedule. Workshops can be led in a variety of styles and formats, including lecture and questions, interactive, experiential, video, practical application, etc. A Call for Workshops is distributed in the fall before an Institute, and leaders are chosen by the planning team. Proposals on similar themes may be asked to combine. The submission deadline is January 1. Workshop leaders must register.
- 3. **Roundtable Luncheon Discussions:** A chance for any conference participant to lead a discussion and networking session about a topic, interest, or question of concern to them. Can be used for members of faith groups to meet one another. Proposals for Roundtable Luncheon Discussions use the same form as a workshop proposal, but can also be submitted up to the Institute and/or arranged on site.
- 4. **Poster Sessions**. This is a new format for the Summer Institute as of 2019. A poster board will enable people to present on a program, research study, or other topic of interest. We anticipate placing them in a common area on a daily basis. Poster presenters must be registered. Use Presentation Form to submit.
- 5. **Meditations**. Our days begin and end with times for interfaith meditation and reflection. A proposal format will be available by 1/1/2019 on the <u>website</u>. Team leadership encouraged.
- 6. **Exhibits:** Exhibit tables are also available for publishers, programs, organizations and resource providers. An exhibit registration includes one registration for its coordinator. Exhibits are reserved through the registration process, but exhibitors are welcome to alert the planning team that you are interested.
- 7. **Books and resources**: If you are an author or developer of a particular resource, we have a Cooperative Resource Exhibit that highlights books and other resources.
