# Accessibility and Accommodations Information 2017 Summer Institute on Theology and Disability

### Transportation to and from Azusa Pacific University

Campus Maps and Directions to Azusa Pacific University, plus Public Transportation Options

- If you are flying, remember that there are several airports near Los Angeles **and prices to and from one may be better than another.** The closest airport to Azusa Pacific is Ontario International Airport. (26 minutes) See a <u>list</u> of the airports and options for getting to campus here. The FlyAway buses and Metro Gold Line are probably the most reasonable option from LAX. Both are accessible.
- There are regular shuttles from Ontario and LAX to Azusa. We are not organizing specific Summer Institute shuttles.

Accessible Transportation from the airports: Shuttle services such as <u>Opoli</u> as well as <u>Lyft</u> have accessible transportation, but you need to reserve ahead of time. You can also use the FlyAway buses from the airport to Union Station, and the Metro Gold Line to Azusa.

### **Lodging**

- Just like Western Theological Seminary and Hope College, our primary lodging is in the dorms and the residence options, cafeteria and meeting spaces are very close to one another. Google Azusa Pacific University and look at the <u>East Campus map</u>. Engstrom Hall is our main lodging. Lower Turner Campus is the dining hall, and Wilden Hall is where most of the sessions will take place.
- There will lodging options ranging double occupancy (\$35per person per night) to single (\$40 per person per night. One linen package will cost \$10. 10% housing tax on room charges are included in those prices. In Engstrom, each double bedroom shares a bath with another similar bedroom. There are six double room/shared baths in Engstrom with fully accessible baths.
- There is one of the MOD (cottages) that is accessible, with two bedrooms, but the bathroom has a tub.
- If the Engstrom and MOD accessible options fill up, there is another dorm with accessible rooms and baths, but the bathrooms are traditional same sex bathrooms shared by a unit of rooms.
- We have put a hold on accessible rooms with fully accessible baths in two hotels: The Holiday Inn and Fairfield Inn in West Covina. Email Bill Gaventa for instructions if you want one of those. Currently, we do not have accessible transportation between the hotels and the East Campus. If you want to get an idea of where they are, <u>click here.</u>

- Bethany McKinney Fox and our registration office at Fuller Theological Seminary will be assigning rooms based on your preferences and choices.

## Venues

Tentatively, we are using Munson Chapel for plenaries, Wilden Atrium for exhibits, breaks and workshops, and Lower Turner Campus for meals. We do not have the perfect plenary space, but the best is Munson Chapel/recital hall, which has fixed seating, but wide side aisles with four flat areas that can be used by people using chairs, and a large space down front. We will arrange for small tables in these areas so there is a place to write. Wilden, two buildings away, has the best bathrooms for everyone, and Lower Turner Campus has a limited number of accessible bathrooms.
